CAL POLY CORPORATION is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit auxiliary organization\* that operates for an exclusive purpose: to carry out the mission and educational programs that benefit Cal Poly.

All funds generated by the corporation go back to Cal Poly, providing financial and facility resources for students.

The corporation is 100 percent self-supporting and receives no state funding. Operating costs are covered by administrative fees charged to units the corporation supports.

## CAMPUS LIFE

The corporation supports the campus community's daily life, delivering important commercial and administration services. Vital services include food, books, and facility and staff hiring.

## STUDENT ATHLETES

A significant sponsor of the Mustangs athletic program, the Cal Poly Corporation specifically donates \$150,000 annually, providing free or reduced meals for student athletes.

## STUDENT EARNING

The corporation is one the largest employers in San Luis Obispo County, employing more than 3,000 students in 2016/17. Beyond earning a paycheck, students gain important life and career skills as a corporation employee, positioning them for success after graduation.

## UNIVERSITY RESEARCH

With its sponsored programs department, the corporation supports innovative research activities – many involving students in research support positions through its post grant oversight and sponsored programs activities. Research activities range from developing communication satellites and harnessing energy from waves, to building nutrition programs for families in need.

## LEARN BY DOING

The corporation gives fiscal and administrative support to commercial units involving student staffing and learning. These include Swanton Pacific Ranch, the Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship, the student-managed University Graphic Systems (UGS), and agricultural enterprise operations – such as dairy manufacturing, crop science and the Animal Nutrition Center.

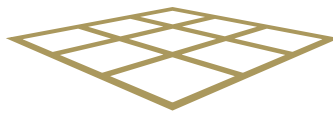
